## **ROTORUA REORUA FUND**

This special Matariki funding round has been created to support Te Arawa or Te Arawa coled Matariki projects

## FUND GUIDELINES

## Funding Value: \$10,000.00

On 11 August 2017, Te Tatau o Te Arawa, with support from its partner, the Rotorua Lakes Council and Te Puni Kōkiri, launched Rotorua Reorua as the first bilingual city in Aotearoa. A city in which we support and promote both te reo Māori and English language.

The Rotorua Reorua fund is jointly funded by Rotorua Lakes Council and Te Tatau o Te Arawa to help achieve Rotorua Reorua goals and in so doing promote Community Wellbeing and the achievement of <u>Vision 2030 – The Rotorua Way</u>

Rotorua Reorua goals are to: normalise te reo Māori and have it seen, heard and celebrated alongside te reo Pākehā in different spaces and places in our city (and district).

As well as helping to meet Rotorua Reorua goals, the Rotorua Reorua fund aims to meet <u>Te</u> <u>Arawa 2050 Vision</u> aspirations, in particular the Te Arawatanga whāinga that: *our future has Te Arawa reo, tikanga and values woven into the everyday of our people, our partners and the communities in our rohe.* 

This special funding round has been committed to Te Arawa led or co-led, Matariki initiatives that deliver on the values for Matariki Celebrations for 2022 in addition to our Rotorua Reorua goals and Te Arawatanga aspirations.

<u>The Values for Matariki Celebrations</u> has been prepared by Professor Rangi Matamua on behalf of the Matariki Advisory Committee and can be viewed <u>here</u>.

#### Total value: \$10,000.00

#### Applying for funding

- Applicants and their kaupapa must reside in the Rotorua District.
- Funds are currently available from the kaupapa reorua fund for not-for-profit purposes and projects in relation to **Matariki 2022** and that supports the Rotorua Reorua goals.
- Priority will be given to those kaupapa that a wide range of people will be able to participate in.
- We accept applications in Te Reo Māori and English

#### What we don't fund

We will not consider funding from the Reorua fund for:

- Project that is being conducted or held outside of the Rotorua District
- Groups operating outside of the Rotorua District
- Overseas travel
- Funds for the creation of loans, scholarships, gifts etc
- No retrospective applications will be considered
- Capital items in general. The exception would be bilingual signage that can be reused in the future.

#### Value of funds available

A total of \$10,000.00 is available in this special funding round to be distributed within the Rotorua District Community.

Applications for the full amount are welcome. However, we expect - due to demand, that average distributions will likely be between \$500 - \$2,500.

#### Other important information

- Funds must be used for the purpose of which they were granted.
- Successful applications will be selected by the funding committee. The decision will be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Successful applicant/s must acknowledge funding partner Te Tatau o Te Arawa, Rotorua Lakes Council and Rotorua Reorua in their promotional activities

Funds may only be spent as approved in your application. Once completed you will be required to provide us with a report on your kaupapa.

This report must include

- 1. Number of attendees
- 2. How your event/project met the Matariki Values and Rotorua Reorua goals
- 3. Copies of receipts
- 4. Photographs of the event/project should be provided wherever possible.
- 5. We accept reports in Te Reo Māori and English
